

Your Care, Your Way: Accessible healthcare information for everyone


Healthwatch England's new campaign, *Your Care, Your Way*, aims to make sure that everyone is given healthcare information in the way they need it, so that they can make informed decisions about their health and care and get the most out of services.



To launch the campaign last week, Healthwatch England published new research showing that many publicly funded health and social care providers are not fully complying with the Accessible Information Standard (AIS), which requires services to make sure people are given information in accessible formats. As the NHS is now reviewing the AIS, Healthwatch is calling for improved accountability and implementation.

Healthwatch England published its annual report this month, highlighting to Parliament how public feedback has helped NHS and social care services improve care during a time of enormous challenge.

A record two million people turned to Healthwatch across England last year, to have their say on care or to get the right advice and information. Healthwatch used their feedback to alert decision-makers to the pressing issues in health and care, identifying what's working well and suggesting improvements, ultimately leading to better care.
