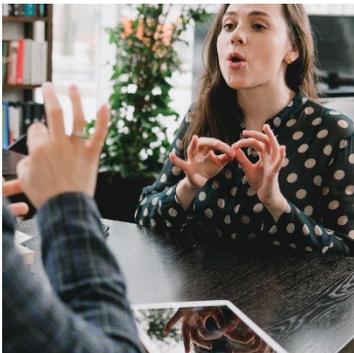

We're asking young people about health and care

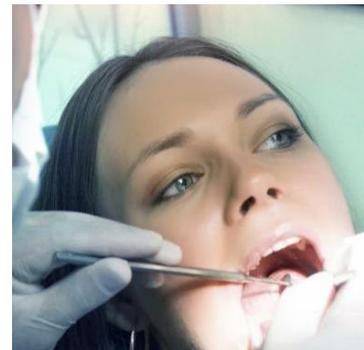

£50 million for NHS dental care, but ongoing need for reform

This week the Government announced [£50 million for 350,000 extra NHS dental appointments](#) in England by the end of March. This funding is welcome and we are pleased that children, people with learning disabilities, autism, or severe mental health problems will be prioritised. However, review and reform of dental care is still needed.



Access to NHS dentistry has been one of the most significant issues raised with Healthwatch across England over the last 18 months. We have seen an increase in the volume of feedback and the amount of negative sentiment. We will continue to share public feedback about dental care in Gloucestershire and to support Healthwatch England's call for wider reform due to the "deeper and more systemic challenges in the dental sector that have been laid bare over the last two years... after this dreadful pandemic." NHS England and NHS Improvement launched a new campaign in January to promote NHS mental health services. This feedback has helped inform how CQC regulates services, and guided Healthwatch recommendations at a national and local level to drive service improvements.

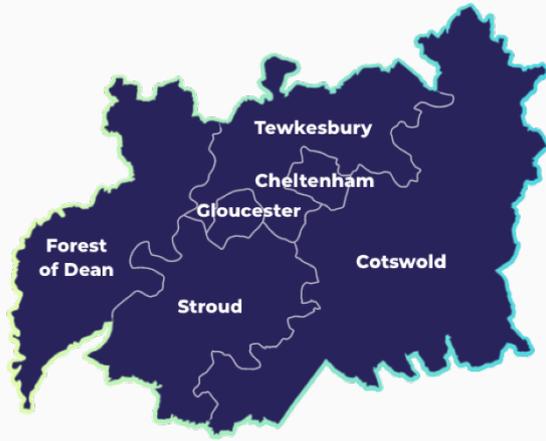
